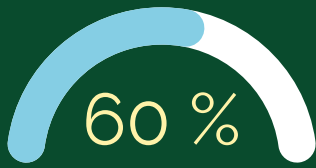


FINNISH FOREST OWNERS: PURSUING MULTIPLE OBJECTIVES

Private persons' forests produce 80 % of the industrial wood demand.

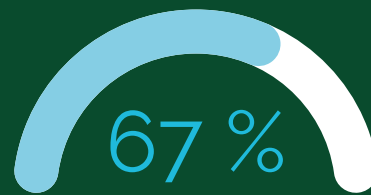
